2006 Announcement and Call for Papers

Introduction

The **IST-Africa 2006** Conference takes place in Pretoria, South Africa. This is the first in a series of Annual Conferences supported by the European Commission, which will bring together delegates from commercial, government & research organisations across Africa and from Europe, to bridge the Digital Divide by sharing knowledge, experience, lessons learnt and good practice.

The goals of the IST-Africa Conference Series are Community Building to facilitate EU-African research cooperation and successful exploitation of research results, to stimulate take-up of RTD results by industry, Small and Medium Sized Businesses and the public sector, to promote knowledge sharing between commercial organizations, government agencies and the research community, to exchange experiences about the current state of eAdoption at a sectoral, national or regional level, and to support International Cooperation and open up the European Research Area (ERA) to Africa.

Conference Focus

IST-Africa 2006 will focus on Applied IST research topics addressing major societal and economic challenges, which is part of the European Commission's Information Society Technologies (IST) programme. The programme combines strategic keynote presentations, technical and policy papers, case studies, workshops, an exhibition and social activities.

The IST-Africa Conference will provide a collegiate setting for presentations and discussions of national and regional developments, issues of concern and good practice models. It will also provide an excellent networking environment for delegates (including IST-Africa workshop delegates) to discuss problems, share knowledge, obtain feedback, and learn more about opportunities to participate in IST Calls under FP7.

IST-Africa 2006 will provide a forum to *showcase* the achievements of FP6 and Regional, National and International ICT related initiatives in Africa, and *look forward to the future* by focusing on relevant thematic priorities of FP7. The 'European Research Area' (ERA) and research priorities and trends for the future will also be discussed.

Submission of Papers

Paper submissions are now invited for IST-Africa 2006. The conference language is English and submissions should be for technical or visionary papers, and business or government case studies within the scope of the conference. *Papers* (4,000 – 5,000 words) using the *IST-Africa Paper Template*, must be registered on the conference portal (www.IST-Africa.org) by 30th November 2005.

Your paper structure should incorporate:

- Abstract (Paper summary in 150 250 words)
- Introduction Issues to be addressed
- Objectives of your paper
- Methodology Used
- Technology or Business Case Description
- Conclusions and Summary Recommendations
- References

It should *focus on a research or eAdoption topic* on which a case study, initial or final results can be published. General project descriptions are not appropriate. All papers must *highlight the level of innovation and actual or expected impact*. Criteria for proposals for workshop sessions are provided on www.IST-Africa.org.

As all papers will be double blind peer reviewed, please ensure that *no contact details* are provided within the text or Properties of the paper submitted. All contact details will be submitted online as part of the Registration and Submission Process.

Papers or sessions can take the form of:

- Presentation of innovative ICT achievements
- Presentation of eAdoption achievements

- Lessons learnt from case studies, regional and national programmes and initiatives
- Discussion of future oriented technologies
- Discussion of existing and emerging standards
- Discussion of ERA or future oriented issues
- Discussion of current status of eAdoption in a specific industry sector, country or region
- Discussion of legal and contractual issues

It is a condition of submitting a paper that (a) authors act on feedback and comments provided by the International Programme Committee (IPC) to ensure high quality conference proceedings, (b) presenters act on feedback provided by their Session Chair to ensure high quality presentations, and (c) presenters register and pay the participant's fee by 28th February, before the papers are sent to the publisher.

Publishing schedule for IST-Africa 2006

- Draft Final Paper and workshop proposals submitted by 30th November 2005
- Provisional acceptance of draft final papers with IPC feedback provided by 31st January
- Final papers to be delivered electronically by 28^{th} *February* for editorial review and quality check
