Current Open Calls for Proposals

There are currently two Calls for Proposals currently open - FP7-AFRICA-2010 and FP7-ICT-Call6.

IST-Africa has prepared a <u>Guide to FP7</u> to assist organisations looking at the Framework Programme 7 for the first time. This Guide provides an overview of FP7, how to go about identifying relevant research areas, open Action Lines, how to prepare a budget and Frequently Asked Questions. This is a living document, which is updated based on Open Calls.

DG Research - FP7-Africa-2010 Call - Opened 30 July, Closes 14 Jan '10

DG Research launched a new Call focused on two major areas: Water and Food Security and Better Health for Africa. It is focused on a holistic approach involving various scientific and technological research fields such as food, agriculture, health, land and water resources including their interaction with climate change and integrating broader socio-economic factors such as migration and resettlement, urbanisation, health care systems and programme interventions.

Action Lines are open under three themes:

- ➤ Theme 1: Health
- ➤ Theme 2 Food, Agriculture and Fisheries and Biotechnology
- ➤ Theme 6 Environment (including Climate Change).

All submissions will be double blind reviewed by the International Programme Committee and authors will receive feedback by 26 February. Accepted authors will then be invited to submit a final paper taking account of feedback provided for inclusion in the conference proceedings by 31 March.

African Union 2010 Summit, 29 January – 02 February 2010

The Assembly of the Heads of State at the Second Ordinary Session of the African Union Summit held in Addis-Ababa, Ethiopia in January 2009 approved the Decision (Assembly/AU/Dec. 232(XII)) on to have the January 2010 Summit theme focused on "Information and Communications Technologies in Africa: Challenges and Prospects for Development".

The 2010 AU Summit will take place in Addis Ababa on 29 January - 02 February 2010 and will be attended by the Heads of States and Governments. During this Summit, key issues for consideration will be:

- (a) The Enabling Environment for Growth
- (b) ICT Infrastructure Development
- (c) Africa in the Economics of the Internet
- (d) Capacity Building and Research & Development

In parallel with the Summit, the Department of Human Resources Science and Technology, AUC in cooperation with UNECA are organising an Exhibition of Information Communication Technologies and Innovation for Africa.

The goal is to increase visibility of mutual RTD potential and network relevant European and African stakeholders. The Annual IST-Africa Conference provides an opportunity to showcase relevant research capacity. IST-Africa 2010 (19 - 21 May) is hosted by South Africa.
