# IST-Africa 2008 Conference

Hosted by Government of Namibia through the Ministry of Education, IST-Africa 2008 Conference & Exhibition took place 07 - 09 May 2008 in Windhoek, Namibia. Part of the IST-Africa Initiative, which is supported by the European Commission under the Information Communications Technologies (ICT) Theme of Framework Programme 7 (FP7), IST-Africa 2008 was the third in an Annual Conference Series bringing together delegates from leading commercial, government & research organisations, to bridge the Digital Divide and identify mutual research opportunities between Europe and Africa by sharing knowledge, experience, lessons learnt & good practice.

IST-Africa 2008 was very successful, attracting over 450 delegates from Europe and Africa. Plenary speakers included Ministers of Science and Technology from Namibia, Uganda, Tanzania and Kenya, Director Generals from DG Information Society and Media and DG



Research of the European Commission and DST South Africa and Directors from the African Union Commission, United Nations Economic Commission for Africa and SADC Secretariat.

A high-level Round Table on the Implementation of the Africa-EU Partnership on Science, Information Society and Space took place during the Opening Plenary session, which was highly successful.
