IST-Africa 2014 – Conference Report

Hosted by the Government of Mauritius through the Ministry of Information and Communication Technology and the National Computer Board, and Supported by the European Commission (EC) and African Union Commission (AUC), <u>IST-Africa 2014</u> (06 - 09 May) was the ninth in an annual series of Ministerial Level Technology Research Conferences. IST-Africa 2014 was technically co-sponsored by IEEE Mauritius Subsection and IEEE UK&RI Social Implications of Technology Chapter. Final papers accepted for inclusion in the Proceedings (following updates as a result of the blind peer review) will also be submitted to IEEE Xplore for publication.

IST-Africa 2014 was very successful with over 460 delegates from 44 countries actively participated over the 4 days. Please download the <u>Conference Report</u> for more information.

Horizon 2020

<u>Horizon 2020</u> commenced in January 2014 as the new Framework Programme for research and innovation from 2014 – 2020. There are three main pillars – Excellence Science, Industrial Leadership, Societal Challenges.

IST-Africa CAAST-Net Plus Horizon 2020 Workshop & NCP Training, 07 – 09 May

IST-Africa and CAAST-Net Plus organised a joint Horizon 2020 Workshop on 09 May during IST-Africa 2014 in Mauritius. Mr Morten Møller, Programme Coordination, DG CONNECT, European Commission provided a detailed presentation on Horizon 2020 and highlighted the ICT-39 International Cooperation Call that closes in April 2015. IST-Africa and CAAST-Net Plus outlined upcoming Calls under Societal Challenges (Health, Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture, Environment) and LEIT, Horizon 2020 Participation Rules and Instruments and steps involved in preparing a proposal and associated budget. This session was very well attended and was interactive in style with a lot of questions and discussion.

IST-Africa and CAAST-Net Plus jointly organised a closed Horizon 2020 Training Session for African National Contact Points (NCPs) during IST-Africa 2014. IST-Africa supported the participation of ICT National Contact Points from Angola, Botswana, Burundi, Cameroon, Egypt, Ethiopia, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Senegal, South Africa, Swaziland, Tanzania, Tunisia and Uganda. CAAST-Net Plus supported the participation of Health NCPs from Ethiopia, Ghana, Lesotho, Malawi, Senegal, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda. The private training session provided an opportunity for the NCPs to learn more about how NCP Networks function in other African countries, information sources that they can access to support their activities, to meet NCPs from other African countries and to ask questions in relation to practical challenges that they are facing while supporting their national institutions. This session was considered to be very beneficial in supporting capacity building.

AfDB approves first Human Capital Strategy

The African Development Bank Group (AfDB) first Human Capital Strategy (HCS) was approved by the Board of Executive Directors on 28 May 2014 in Tunis. This four-year strategy (2014 – 2018), which is focused on Skills and Technology, provides the operational framework for the Bank's interventions in development in areas such as education, skills development, health, science, technology, innovation, social protection, safety nets and youth employment. Fourth EU-Africa Summit – Roadmap for 2014 - 2017

The Fourth EU-Africa Summit took place in Brussels from 02 - 03 April 2014, focused on the theme of "Investing in People, Prosperity and Peace". The Heads of State from the EU and Africa confirmed that the Joint Africa-EU Strategy (JAES) adopted at the Lisbon Summit in 2007 remains the strategic political reference for EU-Africa relations.
