IST-Africa 2014 – Advance Programme / Early Bird Registration Deadline 31 March

Hosted by the Government of Mauritius through the Ministry of Information and Communication Technology and the National Computer Board, and Supported by the European Commission (EC) and African Union Commission (AUC), [IST-Africa 2014](#) (06 - 09 May) is the ninth in an annual series of Ministerial Level Technology Research Conferences. IST-Africa 2014 is technically co-sponsored by IEEE Mauritius Subsection and IEEE UK&RI Social Implications of Technology Chapter. Final papers accepted for inclusion in the Proceedings (following updates as a result of the blind peer review) will also be submitted to IEEE Xplore for publication.

The [Advance Programme](#) features an Opening and Closing Plenary Session and a Scientific Programme with 37 thematically focused sessions (including workshops on Horizon 2020, African Research Capacity and eInfrastructures) featuring over 150 presenters from public, private, education and research organisations in 37 countries (15 European, 20 African Member States, Japan, India and US).

The IST-Africa Living Labs Working Group meeting is on Tuesday 06 May.

[Horizon 2020](#) commenced in January 2014 as the new Framework Programme for research and innovation from 2014 – 2020. There are three main pillars – Excellence Science, Industrial Leadership, Societal Challenges.
