IST-Africa 2009 Conference - Call for Papers Extended Deadline 28 November

Hosted by Government of Uganda through the Ministry of ICT, IST-Africa 2009 Conference & Exhibition will take place 06 - 08 May 2009 in Uganda.

Part of the IST-Africa Initiative, which is supported by the European Commission under the ICT Theme of Framework Programme 7 (FP7), IST-Africa 2009 is the fourth in an Annual Conference Series which brings together senior representatives from leading commercial, government & research organisations across Africa and from Europe, to bridge the Digital Divide by sharing knowledge, experience, lessons learnt and good practice and discussing policy related issues.

The scientific programme for IST-Africa 2009 is based on an open Call for Papers and the conference language is English.

Interested presenters are encouraged to prepare an 8 page paper (4,000 - 5,000) words following the IST-Africa 2009 paper guidelines and paper template for submission online by 28 November. All submissions will be double blind reviewed by the International Programme Committee and authors will receive feedback in late January. Accepted authors will then be invited to submit a final paper taking account of feedback provided for inclusion in the conference proceedings by end of February.

IST-Africa Guide to ICT Research

The IST-Africa Consortium is compiling a Guide to ICT Research Capacity in Botswana, Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda. This will be published as an online book on an iterative basis with the final report published in 2009.

This online book provides an overview of Framework Programme 7, funding instruments and examples of projects funded under FP6 & FP7 focused on cooperation with Sub-Saharan Africa.

Each country section provides an introduction, an overview of the ICT National Strategy, national research agenda and activities, identification of areas for research co-operation with the EU under FP7 and links to profiles of high potential research organisations.

The initial sections for Botswana and Uganda are now available online. Other countries will be published on an iterative basis.

The 6th EuroAfriCa-ICT Concertation Meeting organised with the support of the European Commission's DG Information Media and Society (DG INFSO) will take place at the European Commission premises in Brussels, Belgium on 10 December 2008. Envisioned agenda items include keynote addresses on roles and visions of ICT research cooperation between Europe, the Caribbean and sub-Saharan Africa, sharing perspectives on the way forward in light of the recent EU-AU partnership implementation for Science, Information society and Space as well as introduction and guidelines on the next FP7 ICT Call 4. Registration is free but pre-registration is compulsory.

IST-Africa (Regional Impact of Information Society Technologies in Africa) is a collaborative Initiative between IIMC (Ireland, Coordinator), Ministry of Communications, Science and Technology (Botswana), Ministry of Communications, Science and Technology (Lesotho), Commonwealth Network of Information Technology for Development (Malta), ICT Policy Implementation Technical Unit (Mozambique), Ministry of Education (Namibia), Wits Commercial Enterprise (Pty) Ltd (South Africa), COSTECH - Tanzania Commission for Science and Technology, and Uganda National Council for Science and Technology.

Over 2008 - 2009 with support from DG Information Society and Media under FP7, IST-Africa will focus on raising wider awareness of African research capacity, promote participation of African organizations in the ICT Theme of FP7 (FP7-ICT) and identify cooperation opportunities in fields of mutual interest. The goal is to increase visibility of mutual RTD potential and network relevant European and African stakeholders.
