IST-Africa 2009 Conference - Call for Papers Extended Deadline 28 November

Hosted by Government of Uganda through the Ministry of ICT, IST-Africa 2009 Conference & Exhibition will take place 06 - 08 May 2009 in Uganda.

Part of the IST-Africa Initiative, which is supported by the European Commission under the ICT Theme of Framework Programme 7 (FP7), IST-Africa 2009 is the fourth in an Annual Conference Series which brings together senior representatives from leading commercial, government & research organisations across Africa and from Europe, to bridge the Digital Divide by sharing knowledge, experience, lessons learnt and good practice and discussing policy related issues.

The scientific programme for IST-Africa 2009 is based on an open Call for Papers and the conference language is English.

Interested presenters are encouraged to prepare an 8 page paper (4,000 - 5,000) words following the IST-Africa 2009 paper guidelines and paper template for submission online by 28 November. All submissions will be double blind reviewed by the International Programme Committee and authors will receive feedback in late January. Accepted authors will then be invited to submit a final paper taking account of feedback provided for inclusion in the conference proceedings by end of February.

Recent Developments in relation to Implementation of the Africa-EU Partnership on Science, Information Society and Space

During the Africa-EU Summit in Lisbon in December 2007, the African and European Heads of State agreed the Africa-EU Strategic Partnership which covers 8 thematic areas. For the first time, Science, Information Society and Space is included as a priority area for joint co-operation.

During IST-Africa 2008 Conference in Windhoek in May, a high-level Round Table on the Implementation of the Africa-EU Partnership on Science, Information Society and Space took place during the Opening Plenary session, which was very successful. Participants included Ministers of Science and Technology from Namibia, Uganda, Tanzania and Kenya, Director Generals from DG Information Society and Media and DG Research of the European Commission and DST South Africa and Directors from the African Union Commission, United Nations Economic Commission for Africa and SADC Secretariat. On 01 October, European Commission and African Union Commission held a College-to-College meeting in Brussels to agree the next phase of the Implementation of the 8th Partnership (Science, Information Society and Space).

Janez Potočnik, EU Commissioner for Science and Research, Viviane Reding, EU Commissioner for Information Society and Media, Günter Verheugen, EU Commissioner for Enterprise and Industry, Louis Michel, EU Commissioner for Development and Professor Ezin, African Union Commissioner for Human Resources, Science and Technology discussed a portfolio of 19 "lighthouse projects" identified and designed by the African Union Commission (AUC) to respond to African needs that would serve as the framework for implementing the EU/AU Partnership on Science, ICT and Space and its Action plan. They agreed that 6 of these projects are 'early deliverables' and will receive immediate attention.

The 2 projects in the ICT theme selected for early delivery are the "African Internet Exchange System", focused on enhancing internet deployment and use in Africa, and "Africa Connect" to extend the reach of the European research and education high-speed network GEANT to Sub-Saharan Africa.

The EU and AUC Commissioners also agreed to further use the European 7th Framework Programme for Research (FP7) to broaden African participation notably in the areas of Health, Environment and Climate, Energy, Agriculture and Food, Information and Communication Technologies and Space Applications. The use of FP7 will complement EC Development programmes.

ASEM Workshop on ICT for Development, 8 – 9 December 2008 in Vientiane, Lao PDR

The ASEM Workshop, co-organised by the European Commission and the Lao PDR government, will be held from 8 – 9 December 2008 in Vientiane, Lao PDR. ASEM is an interregional forum, which consists of the European Commission, the twenty-seven members of the European Union (EU), the ten countries of ASEAN, P.R. of China, Japan, South Korea and, as of 2008, the ASEAN secretariat, India, Mongolia, and Pakistan.

The considerable contribution of ICTs to socio-economic development and poverty reduction has been widely recognised by the international community, including the ASEM ICT Ministerial Meeting in Hanoi in November 2006. International development cooperation will be among the topics on the agenda of the 7th ASEM Summit, which will be held in Beijing on 24-25 October 2008.

The ASEM workshop on ICT for Development will aim to facilitate the exchange of best practices and lessons learned at national and international level involving key players in the ICT4D area which should lead to the identification of concrete cooperation projects. This is why a mix of government, NGOs and private sector representatives is expected for this seminar. It will also have as one of its objectives to reach an agreement on an ASEM roadmap that would give recommendations on ICT for development priorities for the coming years that could lead to concrete development initiatives.

As part of the ASEM workshop we will also celebrate the launch of the TransEurasia Information Network 3 (TEIN 3), an ASEM initiative that provides high-speed data interconnections for all research and education communities in Asia, to Europe and beyond
